LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE, WAIVER AND CONSENT

Pursuant to FINRA Rule 9216 of FINRA's Code of Procedure, I submit this Letter of Acceptance, Waiver and Consent ("AWC") for the purpose of proposing a settlement of the alleged rule violations described below. This AWC is submitted on the condition that, if accepted, FINRA will not bring any future actions against me alleging violations based on the same factual findings described herein.

I.

ACCEPTANCE AND CONSENT

- A. I hereby accept and consent, without admitting or denying the findings, and solely for the purposes of this proceeding and any other proceeding brought by or on behalf of FINRA, or to which FINRA is a party, prior to a hearing and without an adjudication of any issue of law or fact, to the entry of the following findings by FINRA:

BACKGROUND

Frederick D. Houck ("Houck") entered the securities industry in August 2003 as a general securities representative with a FINRA member firm. Houck was registered as a General Securities Representative with Freedom Investors Corp. from April 2007 to June 2016. Houck is not currently associated with a FINRA-registered firm. Houck remains subject to FINRA jurisdiction for the purposes of this proceeding, pursuant to Article V, Section 4 of FINRA's Bylaws because: (i) the AWC was filed within two years following the termination of his registration with FINRA; and (ii) the AWC concerns conduct that occurred while he was associated with a FINRA member firm.

RELEVANT DISCIPLINARY HISTORY

Houck has no relevant disciplinary history.

FACTS AND VIOLATIVE CONDUCT

NASD Rule 2510(b) provides that registered persons may not exercise discretionary power in a customer's account unless the customer has given prior written authorization and the account has been accepted by the member firm in writing as a discretionary account.

From August 2011 through September 2015, Houck exercised discretion in executing 491 transactions in the accounts of two customers pursuant to a recommended investment strategy. Houck did not obtain prior written authorization from his customers to exercise discretion in their accounts and Freedom had not approved these accounts for discretionary trading. In addition, while this conduct was ongoing during December 2014, Houck submitted to Freedom an acknowledgement of its Standards of Conduct, which Houck initialed and signed to certify, contrary to his ongoing course of conduct, that he would not exercise any discretionary power in effecting a transaction for a customer's account.

By virtue of the foregoing, Houck violated NASD Rule 2510(b) and FINRA Rule 2010.

- B. I also consent to the imposition of the following sanctions:
- A two month suspension in all capacities from association with any FINRA-registered firm.

I understand that if I am barred or suspended from associating with any FINRA member, I become subject to a statutory disqualification as that term is defined in Article III, Section 4 of FINRA's By-Laws, incorporating Section 3(a)(39) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Accordingly, I may not be associated with any FINRA member in any capacity, including clerical or ministerial functions, during the period of the bar or suspension (see FINRA Rules 8310 and 8311).

On May 18, 2017, Respondent Frederick Houck filed a Chapter 7 bankruptcy petition pursuant to Title 11, United States Code. Accordingly, no monetary sanction is being assessed in this matter.

The sanctions imposed herein shall be effective on a date set by FINRA staff.

II.

WAIVER OF PROCEDURAL RIGHTS

I specifically and voluntarily waive the following rights granted under FINRA's Code of Procedure:

- A. To have a Complaint issued specifying the allegations against me;
- B. To be notified of the Complaint and have the opportunity to answer the allegations in writing;
- C. To defend against the allegations in a disciplinary hearing before a hearing panel, to have a written record of the hearing made and to have a written decision issued; and
- D. To appeal any such decision to the National Adjudicatory Council ("NAC") and then to the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission and a U.S. Court of Appeals.

Further, I specifically and voluntarily waive any right to claim bias or prejudgment of the Chief Legal Officer, the NAC, or any member of the NAC, in connection with such person's or body's participation in discussions regarding the terms and conditions of this AWC, or other consideration of this AWC, including acceptance or rejection of this AWC.

I further specifically and voluntarily waive any right to claim that a person violated the ex parte prohibitions of FINRA Rule 9143 or the separation of functions prohibitions of FINRA Rule 9144, in connection with such person's or body's participation in discussions regarding the terms and conditions of this AWC, or other consideration of this AWC, including its acceptance or rejection.

III.

OTHER MATTERS

I understand that:

- A. Submission of this AWC is voluntary and will not resolve this matter unless and until it has been reviewed and accepted by the NAC, a Review Subcommittee of the NAC, or the Office of Disciplinary Affairs ("ODA"), pursuant to FINRA Rule 9216;
- B. If this AWC is not accepted, its submission will not be used as evidence to prove any of the allegations against me; and


C. If accepted:

- 1. this AWC will become part of my permanent disciplinary record and may be considered in any future actions brought by FINRA or any other regulator against me;**
- 2. this AWC will be made available through FINRA's public disclosure program in accordance with FINRA Rule 8313;**
- 3. FINRA may make a public announcement concerning this agreement and the subject matter thereof in accordance with FINRA Rule 8313; and**
- 4. I may not take any action or make or permit to be made any public statement, including in regulatory filings or otherwise, denying, directly or indirectly, any finding in this AWC or create the impression that the AWC is without factual basis. I may not take any position in any proceeding brought by or on behalf of FINRA, or to which FINRA is a party, that is inconsistent with any part of this AWC. Nothing in this provision affects my: (i) testimonial obligations; or (ii) right to take legal or factual positions in litigation or other legal proceedings in which FINRA is not a party.**

- D. I may attach a Corrective Action Statement to this AWC that is a statement of demonstrable corrective steps taken to prevent future misconduct. I understand that I may not deny the charges or make any statement that is inconsistent with the AWC in this Statement. This Statement does not constitute factual or legal findings by FINRA, nor does it reflect the views of FINRA or its staff.**

I certify that I have read and understand all of the provisions of this AWC and have been given a full opportunity to ask questions about it; that I have agreed to its provisions voluntarily; and that no offer, threat, inducement, or promise of any kind, other than the terms set forth herein and the prospect of avoiding the issuance of a Complaint, has been made to induce me to submit it.


