- (a) Pursuant to the provisions of Section 19(b)(1) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 ("Act" or "Exchange Act"), <sup>1</sup> Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. ("FINRA") is filing with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC" or "Commission") a proposed rule change to delay implementation of FINRA Rule 2242 (Debt Research Analysts and Debt Research Reports) until July 16, 2016. The proposed rule change would not make any other changes to FINRA rules.

### 2. Procedures of the Self-Regulatory Organization

The filing of the proposed rule change with the SEC was authorized by the FINRA Board of Governors at its meeting on July 11, 2013. No other action by FINRA is necessary for the filing of the proposed rule change.

FINRA has filed the proposed rule change for immediate effectiveness and has requested that the Commission waive the requirement that the proposed rule change not become operative for 30 days after the date of the filing.

## 3. <u>Self-Regulatory Organization's Statement of the Purpose of, and Statutory Basis for, the Proposed Rule Change</u>

(a) Purpose

On November 14, 2014, FINRA filed proposed rule change SR-FINRA-2014-048 to adopt new FINRA Rule 2242 (Debt Research Analysts and Debt Research Reports) to address conflicts of interest relating to the publication and distribution of debt research

reports.<sup>2</sup> On February 19, 2015, FINRA filed Amendment No. 1 responding to the comments received to the proposal as well as to propose amendments in response to these comments.<sup>3</sup> The proposed rule change, as modified by Amendment No. 1 thereto, was approved by the Commission on July 16, 2015.<sup>4</sup>

Pursuant to proposed rule change SR-FINRA-2014-048, FINRA proposed to announce the effective date of the proposed rule change in a Regulatory Notice to be published no later than 60 days following Commission approval. FINRA further stated that the effective date will be no later than 180 days following publication of the Regulatory Notice announcing Commission approval. FINRA announced an effective date of February 22, 2016 in a Regulatory Notice published on August 26, 2015.<sup>5</sup> In response to industry questions regarding implementation of the requirements of Rule 2242, FINRA delayed implementation of Rule 2242 until April 22, 2016.<sup>6</sup>

FINRA continues to receive questions regarding implementation of the requirements of Rule 2242. Therefore, to give members additional time to implement the requirements of Rule 2242, FINRA believes that it is appropriate to extend the

implementation date and is proposing to delay implementation of Rule 2242 until July 16, 2016.

As noted in Item 2 of this filing, FINRA has filed the proposed rule change for immediate effectiveness and has requested that the Commission waive the requirement that the proposed rule change not become operative for 30 days after the date of the filing.

### (b) Statutory Basis

FINRA believes that the proposed rule change is consistent with the provisions of Section 15A(b)(6) of the Act,<sup>7</sup> which requires, among other things, that FINRA rules must be designed to prevent fraudulent and manipulative acts and practices, to promote just and equitable principles of trade, and, in general, to protect investors and the public interest. FINRA believes the proposed rule change is consistent with the Act in that it provides members additional time to implement the requirements of Rule 2242, which addresses conflicts of interest relating to the publication and distribution of debt research reports.

### 4. <u>Self-Regulatory Organization's Statement on Burden on Competition</u>

FINRA does not believe that the proposed rule change will result in any burden on competition that is not necessary or appropriate in furtherance of the purposes of the Act. The proposed delay in implementation of Rule 2242 will reduce the burden on members by allowing additional time to implement the requirements of the Rule.

FINRA requests that the Commission waive the requirement that the rule change, by its terms, not become operative for 30 days after the date of the filing as set forth in Rule 19b-4(f)(6)(iii), so that the proposed rule change, including the delayed implementation of Rule 2242, can become operative before the scheduled effective date of Rule 2242 on April 22, 2016.
