Form 19b-4 Information

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The self-regulatory organization must provide all required information, presented in a clear and comprehensible manner, to enable the public to provide meaningful comment on the proposal and for the Commission to determine whether the proposal is consistent with the Act and applicable rules and regulations under the Act.

Exhibit 1 - Notice of Proposed Rule Change

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The Notice section of this Form 19b-4 must comply with the guidelines for publication in the Federal Register as well as any requirements for electronic filing as published by the Commission (if applicable). The Office of the Federal Register (OFR) offers guidance on Federal Register publication requirements in the Federal Register Document Drafting Handbook, October 1998 Revision. For example, all references to the federal securities laws must include the corresponding cite to the United States Code in a footnote. All references to SEC rules must include the corresponding cite to the Code of Federal Regulations in a footnote. All references to Securities Exchange Act Releases must include the release number, release date, Federal Register cite, Federal Register date, and corresponding file number (e.g., SR-[SRO]-xx-xx). Partial Amendment

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If the self-regulatory organization is amending only part of the text of a lengthy proposed rule change, it may, with the Commission's permission, file only those portions of the text of the proposed rule change in which changes are being made if the filing (i.e. partial amendment) is clearly understandable on its face. Such partial amendment shall be clearly identified and marked to show deletions and additions.

On March 11, 2005, NASD filed SR-NASD-2005-030 to adopt a Uniform Branch Office Registration Form ("Form BR") and to make conforming changes and technical revisions to the Uniform Application for Securities Industry Registration or Transfer ("Form U4") and the Uniform Termination Notice for Securities Industry Registration ("Form U5").

NASD is filing this partial Amendment No. 1 for the purpose of requesting that the Commission make the following two changes:

(1) NASD is adding the words "NASD anticipates that" to the first sentence of the second paragraph of footnote 1 on page 4 and footnote 1 on page 23 of 227 pages. Accordingly, please substitute the following paragraph for the second paragraph of footnote 1 on page 4 and footnote 1 on page 23 (new language is underlined):

With the implementation of the Form BR, NASD anticipates that the SEC will eliminate Schedule E from Form BD, and the NYSE will retire the current NYSE Branch Office Application. Connecticut, Florida, Nevada, and Vermont also have indicated that they plan to retire their respective forms and adopt the Form BR. Other jurisdictions that currently require "notice filings" for branch openings and closings have indicated that they also expect to adopt the Form BR.

(2) NASD is adding an explanation of new specific instructions to the Form U4 and Form U5. Please add the following to footnote 11 on page 12 and footnote 13 on page 31 of 227 pages (new language is underlined):

In addition, the instructions on the Form U4 with respect to submitting fingerprint cards have been modified to describe the radio button representations. New instructions on the Form U5 explain the circumstances under which the office of employment address will be prepopulated.
