On January 10, 2012, FINRA filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC" or "Commission") SR-FINRA-2012-001, a proposed rule change to amend FINRA Rule 4560 (Short-Interest Reporting) to clarify members' recording and reporting obligations and to delete several exceptions to the Rule.

FINRA is filing this Partial Amendment No. 1 to clarify the reference to a defined term in SEC Regulation SHO. Specifically, FINRA is clarifying that Regulation SHO defines the term "short sale," not "short sale transaction." A discussion of the changes is set forth below.

- 1. On page 4 of 19, in the text for Rule 4560(b), delete the word "transaction" (previously proposed to be added to the rule text) so that the text references the term "short sale," as that term is defined in Rule 200(a) of SEC Regulation SHO.
- 2. On pages 7 and 14 of 19, in the sentence that begins, "Thus, the proposed rule change provides that members must report all . . .", delete the word "transaction" between "short sale" and "as that term" to conform the language in the purpose section with the aforementioned change to the rule text.

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4560. Short-Interest Reporting

(a) Each member shall maintain a record of total "short" positions in all customer and proprietary firm accounts in all equity securities (other than Restricted Equity Securities as defined in Rule 6420) and shall regularly report such information to FINRA in such a manner as may be prescribed by FINRA. [Reports shall be made as of the close of the settlement date designated by FINRA.] Reports shall be received by FINRA no later than the second business day after the reporting settlement date designated by FINRA.

(b) [For purposes of this Rule:]

[(1) "short" positions to be reported are those resulting] <u>Members shall</u> record and report all gross short positions existing in each individual firm or customer account, including the account of a broker-dealer, that resulted from (1) <u>a</u> "short sale[s]," as that term is defined in Rule 200(a) of SEC Regulation SHO, or (2) where the transaction(s) that caused the short position was marked "long," consistent with SEC Regulation SHO, due to the firm's or the customer's net long position at the time of the transaction. Members shall report only those short positions resulting from short sales that have settled or reached settlement date by the close of the reporting settlement date designated by FINRA. [with the exception of positions that meet the following requirements:]

(c) The recording and reporting requirements of this Rule shall not apply to:

 $[(A)](\underline{1})$ any sale by any person, for an account in which he has an interest, if such person owns the security sold and intends to deliver such security as soon as is possible without undue inconvenience or expense; and

[(B) any sale of a security (except a sale to a stabilizing bid complying with Rule 104 of SEC Regulation M) effected with the approval of an exchange which is necessary to equalize the price of such security thereon with the current price of such security on another national securities exchange which is the principal exchange market for such security;]

[(C) any sale of a security for a special arbitrage account by a person who then owns another security by virtue of which he is, or presently will be entitled to acquire an equivalent number of securities of the same class as the securities sold; provided such sale, or the purchase which such sale offsets, is effected for the bona fide purpose of profiting from a current difference between the price of the security sold and the security owned and that such right of acquisition was originally attached to or represented by another security or was issued to all the holders of any such class of securities of the issuer;]

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[(D) any sale of a security registered on, or admitted to unlisted trading privileges on, a national securities exchange effected for a special international arbitrage account for the bona fide purpose of profiting from a current difference between the price of such security on a securities market not within or subject to the jurisdiction of the United States and on a securities market subject to the jurisdiction of the United States; provided the seller at the time of such sale knows or, by virtue of information currently received, has reasonable grounds to believe that an offer enabling him to cover such sale is then available to him in such foreign securities market and intends to accept such offer immediately; and]

[(E)](2) any sale by an underwriter, or any member of a syndicate or group participating in the distribution of a security, in connection with an overallotment of securities, or any lay-off sale by such a person in connection with a distribution of securities through rights or a standby underwriting commitment.

[(2) the term "customer" includes a broker-dealer.]

••• Supplementary Material: -----

<u>.01 A member's reported short-interest position must reflect company-related actions,</u> adjusted as of the ex-date, that result in an increase or decrease in the member's short position (e.g., in-kind dividends and stock splits). If an ex-date has not been declared by an SRO with respect to a company-related action, adjustments must be made as of the payable date. For the purposes of this provision, the term "ex-date" is as defined in FINRA Rule 11120(d).

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
