Individual Snapshot Reports Now Available Online

Executive Summary

Individuals who are or have been registered as a broker or investment adviser representative can now access their Individual Snapshot Report (Snapshot) online.

Discussion

Individuals who are or have been registered as a broker or investment adviser representative may review their registration and licensing information via a Snapshot. A Snapshot contains information that has been reported about an individual on Forms U4, U5 and U6, including residential and employment history, professional designations and disclosure events, as well as other information such as examination and continuing education history. While much of the information provided in a Snapshot also is available through FINRA BrokerCheck[®] and the SEC's Investment Adviser Public Disclosure database, a Snapshot contains some additional information that is not available through these databases.

Until recently, individuals were able to obtain a Snapshot only by completing a form and mailing or faxing it to FINRA. FINRA would then mail the requested Snapshot to the individual or the third party the individual designated. FINRA has improved this process so that individuals now can obtain a Snapshot online at FINRA's website.¹
